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Boy Scouts of America to Introduce Game Design Merit Badge


Newest badge recognizes the important skills that kids can learn from gaming.

The Boy Scouts of America will introduce a new Game Design Merit Badge this year.

Recognizing that gaming teaches children skills ranging from basic courtesy all the way through to logic and mathematics, The Boy Scouts spent two years designing and testing the new merit badge's requirements with input from volunteers from the games industry.

To earn his new badge, a Scout will need to analyze different types of games, describe the content and theme, and understand the concept of intellectual property as it relates to the games industry. He will put his new knowledge to use by keeping a notebook to chart the design of his very own game project, demonstrating a concept, numerous design iterations based on testing, and feedback from his testers.



Once approved, the Scout may begin to build a prototype of his game, and all mediums are encouraged – from card games all the way through to smartphone apps.

The Boy Scouts is the United States' foremost character development and leadership training program for youths, and their acknowledgement of gaming in strengthening young people's lives is an important step forward in widening the nation's acceptance of the medium. Boy Scouts representatives will be at the SXSW Gaming Expo in Austin, Texas this weekend to introduce the new merit badge to the public.

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



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


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
